St Vincent's Primary School, Clear Island Waters, is part of the Surfers Paradise Catholic Parish.

We have seen enormous growth since 1946, when Fr Neal Shannon was appointed as Parish Priest of Surfers Paradise and the Sisters of Mercy were engaged to administer and service the educational and spiritual needs of the children of the Parish.

In 1949 Sr Mary Flora was appointed as the inaugural Principal of St Vincent's Primary School with 30 children & while the church continued to be used as a school, with enrolments growing to approx. 150 students by 1954 construction on a second story began followed by a new parish church in 1963.

Many dedicated & passionate people have shaped & contributed to the development of such a vibrant and flourishing community, from our humble beginnings as a single story building to where we are now as one of the largest co-educational primary schools (Prep – Year 6). Not to mention, when you visit the Sacred Heart church today which can hold up to 1000 parishioners, it is such a contrast to when our little wooden church was at capacity with only 60 parishioners.

Absentee's and Signing in & Out of School

Being Absent from School

Regular attendance at school is essential for a child's learning and social relationships. When your child is absent, please notify us through the school app BCE Connect.

- Under the Education Act, children are not to be kept home for reasons other than illness and exceptional circumstances.
- During term time, if you experience a lengthy absence, due to illness please inform the school at your earliest convenience.
- If you are going on holiday, please contact the school to arrange any necessary paperwork

Late to School/Early to Leave

- Each student is issued a 'bag tag' to attach to their bag.
- Children who arrive after 8.40am are expected to sign in electronically through the student office by their parent/guardians.
- Any students leaving early must be signed out electronically through the parent office by their parent/guardians.
- Students are not permitted to leave the school grounds during school hours on their own accord.
- Student/s will only be released to those listed in our system or an authorized person.
- When necessary, the Principal will determine the validity of the claim made by a person requesting the release of a student.

Health & Well Being

Sick/Injured Students

If your child is injured or becomes unwell, the teacher will send the child to the Sick Bay with continued care instructions, and if necessary the office staff will notify the parent/caregiver to arrange collection.

School is not the place for sick children or staff members

- Promote and follow personal hygiene measure
- Frequent hand washing
- Avoid touching face
- Cover coughs and sneezes with arm or tissue
- Tissues in the bin and then wash hands
- Don't share food or drink

In accordance with the Department of Health Time Out guidelines, children with any infectious diseases must be excluded from the school for specified times.

Please contact the office for any additional information or concerns.

Medication & Health Care Plans

- Medication will ONLY be administered by the office staff when it is <u>prescribed by a doctor</u>, has a current pharmacy label noting the child's name and a current completed Student Medication Request Form.
- If at any time a child requires medication and the Student Medication Request Form has not been completed, parents will need to come to school to administer.

Panadol/Paracetamol

Office staff are able to administer <u>ONE EMERGENECY DOSE</u> of paracetamol to a child if a current Panadol authority form is on record and the child will then have to be collected from sick bay.

The Student Medication Request Form & Authority to Administer Paracetamol in an Emergency is available on BCE Connect, the Parent Portal & the school website.

Parental Involvement

Even though we can no longer go into the classroom physically, you can still assist by :

- Joining the P & F
- Reading the noticeboards and newsletters
- Supporting special events
- Reading and talking with your child daily
- Supporting our rules and any consequences involved

Parent Volunteers

We are hoping that in the future our families will be able to assist in the tuckshop or classroom activities.

All volunteers must complete the Volunteer Training ONLINE this is available on the Brisbane Catholic Education Website — quick link "Volunteers/Other Personnel Training".

- Once this is completed, drop the certificate into the office
- To remain current on our volunteers list, a signed renewal form is required each year.
- Parents **do not** require a Blue Card to volunteer at the school, all other relatives do.
- It is essential that all volunteers, sign in at the office when they arrive and carry the visitor's pass whilst in the school.
- All volunteers are asked to sign out via the office when they leave.

By following these procedures, we will ensure the safety of the children and comply with our Workplace, Health and Safety requirements.

In the event of a fire, fire drill or lock down, all visitors to the site must follow the evacuation and/or lock down instructions. These will be covered in the volunteer training sessions.

Please note: Each class teacher determines how many volunteers s/he requires and the days that they are needed.

Children with Additional Needs

Additional Learning Support & Guidance Counselling is available based on the individual needs of our students. Please approach the Class Teacher in the first instance if you have any concerns about your child's learning, social or emotional functioning at school.

Where necessary, Student Support Team meetings are offered to parents whose children have developmental, learning and/or social and emotional needs.

These meetings are typically attended by the Principal, Classroom Teacher, Support Teacher Inclusive Education, Guidance Counsellor and Parents to allow a space for everyone to work collaboratively to develop a support plan. This may also include assistance with making referrals to community professionals (e.g. Paediatrician, Psychologist, Speech Pathologist, OT).

Tuckshop

Our school tuckshop is open every day and exclusively uses Munch Monitor to order lunches, uniforms and all school event tickets.

Munch Monitor has several benefits, including the ability to order lunches four weeks in advance with the option to edit or delete an order up until 9:15am on the day, no more lost or forgotten lunch orders and/or money, convenient online account top up & access to statements online at any time.

Please note:- If a frozen item is included in your child's order, these are not delivered to the classrooms. Your child must keep their order bag and returns to the tuckshop for collection of their frozen treat.
